



**2010 National Scout Jamboree
July 26 – August 4, 2010
100 Years of Scouting**

In July, 2010, the final gathering at Fort A. P. Hill, Virginia, for the largest Boy Scouts of America event, the Boy Scout National Jamboree will begin. This is the last time the Boy Scout National Jamboree will be gathering at Fort A.P. Hill. The National Jamboree is like a huge Camporee with 35,000+ scouts and leaders, in 800 troops, plus 5,000+ support staff and activity area personnel.

The Jamboree site becomes approximately the 7th largest city in Virginia, literally overnight in the fields of Fort A.P. Hill, where there are classes for at least 60 merit badges, from Model Railroading to Space exploration, displays from the different military branches (including a tall confidence course), States, Government Agencies, corporate sponsors, patch trading, three huge trading posts with anything and everything that involves Scouting. There are also two giant arena shows with entertainers and audiences of 50,000+ people. There are three Action Centers that are running simultaneously to provide new and exciting opportunities, to try Scouts skills and activities that are very difficult to find in your Scouting back yard. Activities such as: black powder rifle shooting, branding, pioneering on a large scale, BMX biking, repelling, wind sailing, fishing, scuba, zip lines, and on and on. **The first 2 days of your Jamboree trip will be spent touring our Nation's capital, Washington, DC!**

Don't be left behind. Blue Ridge Council is taking applications for the 2010 NATIONAL BOY SCOUT JAMBOREE Council Contingent. We only have 180 scout positions available. The first 180 Scouts to get in their deposit will be able to go. This is a ONCE in a life time event. The 100th year Anniversary of Scouting only occurs once. Make YOUR plans to attend, NOW. Do not be left behind. Ask any leader who has attended in the past about their experiences and you will hear about the great time that is available for the few that go.

To sign up for the Jamboree go to myscouting.org and create a log-in user id and password. You must have your BSA member ID# to create a user account. This is on your membership card, or check with your Scoutmaster. You may also call your Council for your number. There will be a window on the log-in screen informing the user of the BSA member ID number requirement. Create a user account. Then you can create an online application. When submitting, the applicant will be asked to pay a \$10 processing fee payable by credit/debit card. This fee is non-refundable. Once completed, print your confirmation, have your Scoutmaster sign it and take it along with this flyer and your \$100 deposit to the Council Service Center located at 1 Park Plaza in Greenville.
